

Professionalisation of humanitarian safety and security through cooperation

The new initiative, *Danish Interagency Safety Network* (DISN) addressing safety and security challenges among Danish Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) and institutions will be launched on November 3rd.

Around the world, humanitarian aid workers and civil society representatives have been attacked and harassed, also kidnapped and killed regularly. Alone in 2016, 58 major attacks against aid operations occurred, in which 101 aid workers were killed, 98 wounded and 89 kidnapped. The number of attacks and victims have increased over the last decade and affects tens of thousands of aid workers, human rights defenders and journalists on a daily basis.

The independent safety and security network DISN, supported by *Global Focus*, strives to strengthen safety and security risk management within the humanitarian sector particularly through networking, knowledge sharing and training and assist in developing the institutional safety policies in field level platforms among the 32 member organisations and institutions. DISN is aiming to strengthen the standard features of the humanitarian response in volatile contexts and support the implementation of the CSO's activities by addressing safety and security solutions.
